
Guidance Notes

Each risk assessment details the task(s) to be undertaken and identifies the main risks and the people who will be most at risk. The tables at the foot of the page indicate the numerical values assigned to:

L = Likelihood of causing harm

S = Severity of the harm should it occur


R =the calculated risk factor of $R = L \times S$



The assessment using $R = L \times S$ indicates risk value obtained by the introduction of control measures to reduce the probability of the hazard causing harm and this consequently reduces the risk factor to the person(s) carrying out the task and to those around them.

The Risk Assessments are of a generic nature and are intended to cover the majority of tasks undertaken within our industry. They have been carried out by a "competent person" and as such are endorsed by Little Stars Nursery for use.

Risk Rating = Likelihood x Severity
