

## Little book of rhyme








B Diddle Diddle







Twinkle, twinkle, little star How I wonder what you are. Up above the world so high, Like a diamond in the sky.




## And our much loved alternative:

For changing rhyme in this one you could even be a little naughty..!:


"Hey diddle diddle, my cat did a...... piddle?

The cow jumped over the moon


The little dog laughed to see such fun

And the dish ran away with the chocolate bar/ "anything you like"

See if your child can spot what is wrong/ think of more rhymes. What could the cow jump over? A car? Then the dish could run away with a chocolate bar!!



One of our favourite alternatives: Baa Baa Black Sheep, have you any spots? Ves, sir, yes sir, I've got lots Some on my fingers, and some on my toes And one big red one at the end of my.....nose!





Row, row, row your boat, Gently down the stream. Merrily, merrily, merrily, merrily, Life is but a dream.

Row, row, row your boat, Gently down the stream. If you see a crocodile, Don't forget to scream!!!! Some alternative ideas:

Rock, rock rock your boat Gently to the shore If you see a lion Don't forget to roar!!!





Row, row, row your boat Gently down the river If you see a polar bear Don't forget to shiver!!

Be inventive with your rhymes. Ask your children to think of ideas of where to take their boat and see if they can think of a rhyme: what can rhyme with sea?
